# Become an Independent Provider

What is an Independent Provider?

An independent provider is a self-employed person who directly provides services to people with developmental disabilities. They are the backbone of the developmental disabilities system and integral to improving the quality of life for individuals with developmental disabilities.

The Putnam County Board of Developmental Disabilities assists in the coordination of selecting a provider. With help from caregivers and family, they will interview and choose the provider that the individual wants.

### What is a developmental disability?

A developmental disability is a disability that began or developed at birth or during childhood, that typically lasts for an individual's entire life. Developmental disabilities can result in limitations in major life activities, causing a person to need special care, treatment, or services for an extended period of time.

There is a wide range of developmental disabilities an individual can be diagnosed with. Common developmental disabilities include:

- Intellectual impairments
- Autism
- Down syndrome
- Cerebral palsy

## What happens when I become an Independent Provider?

Providers apply and obtain their certification with the Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities. Once certified, they become available on the local and statewide database. This database is shared with individuals who have developmental disabilities when they are in need of a provider.
