SUPPORTIVE TECHNOLOGY: CHOOSING TECHNOLOGY THAT FITS

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY AND REMOTE SUPPORT SERVICES

Many Ohioans with developmental disabilities encounter obstacles in daily tasks and activities as well as accessing education and jobs. Devices that engage in two-way communication or provide step-by step assistance can help people overcome these barriers and help them live the lives they want. For example, many new technologies can help someone feel more secure in their home, provide instruction on how to prepare an evening meal, or help to access public transportation. With these advancements, more Ohioans with developmental disabilities will have the opportunity to experience a life more fully integrated into their community.

Technology First, created through a 2018 executive order, is not a technology-only policy but aims to help people learn more about how to use technology to improve their quality of life and how they can experience more independence and personal freedom. We at PCBDD firmly believe that technology can open doors to connection and independence. We approach technology in a person-centered way to connect you with options that work for you and your family.

WHAT TECHNOLOGY OPTIONS ARE AVAILABLE?

Remote Support: Remote Support allows an off-site direct service provider to monitor and respond to a person's health, safety, and other needs using live communication, while offering the person more independence in their home. Remote Support uses two-way communication in real time, so a person can communicate with their providers when they need them. A person can choose supports like sensors that call for help if someone has fallen or cameras that help monitor who is visiting a person's home. This service is always combined with Assistive Technology.

Assistive Technology: Assistive Technology can be used as a creative solution to help with a person's health and safety and can support a person's desire for more independence at home, in the community, or at work. This service enables people to use smart or electronic devices to increase their independence. It includes things that can help a person cook safely, call for help if someone falls or hurts themselves while at home alone, and remind a person to take medications.

LENDING LIBRARIES

Lending libraries are helpful for people with disabilities to try out different technology based on their needs before purchasing equipment, such as medical equipment or adaptive toys. Many programs offer lending services for free. Through a grant with the Ohio Center for Autism and Low Incidence (OCALI), the Ohio Developmental Disabilities Council has published a list of lending libraries across the State of Ohio.
