School is back in session! That means fall and Halloween are coming around the corner. See the following safety tips and links to ensure a fun and enjoyable school and fall season!



**SCHOOL SAFETY** (Referenced from the National Safety Council)

- ✓ Transportation Safety: Know how to be safe while going to and from school. Types of transportation safety measures include Walking, Bike Riding, Bus Riding, Being Driven to School, and Teen Driving. Click on the "School Safety" headline above for details about each type of transportation.
- ✓ Injury Prevention at School: Choose a backpack carefully that fits your child's needs and is comfortable. While bumps and bruises will happen while your child uses the Playground or participates in Sports, you should never ignore a head injury. Click on the "School Safety" headline above for details about preventing injuries while at school and extracurricular events.

**AUTUMN SAFETY** (Referenced from the National Safety Council)

- ➤ **Be prepared for seasonal illnesses:** Autumn is the start of flu season, and doctors recommended everyone 6 months and older gets vaccinated against the flu. Learn more about flu prevention and the flu vaccine.
- Know the dangers and precautions to enjoy Halloween: Halloween is a fun-filled time for children, but there are many dangers associated with the holiday unrelated to ghouls, goblins and witches. Parents need to take the necessary Halloween safety precautions to make sure their children remain safe while still having fun.
